- We will provide learning opportunities in the following areas:
 - Mapping communities – finding out the key people and organisations.
 - Social media.
 - Matching people and facilitators based on Community Circles criteria.
 - Person-centred practices (including person-centred reviews).
 - Community Circles facilitation.
 - Quality assurance and processes.
 - You will be part of a Groupsite to share and solve problems together.
 - We will match you to a buddy who is also a Community Circles connector.
 - We will link you up to a mentor – someone who has been working as a Community Circles connector for at least a year.
